 Outcome of the Executive Board Discussion on the Command and General Staff Tasking The NWCG staff was briefed on the Executive Board's decisions regarding the C&GS Task Team's proposed recommendations. 	The Executive Board will respond to the task team lead via memorandum, closing out the tasking. The Executive Board will communicate decisions and requested actions, as necessary, to affected stakeholders. NWCG Staff will assist with the necessary staff work to complete these actions.
 Clarification of RT-130 Course Standard and Core Component Oversight Responsibility The Operations and Training Committee (OTC) sought confirmation that the core components of the RT-130 Wildland Fire Safety Training Annual Refresher curriculum are established and maintained by the NWCG (core components information and guidance currently resides in both the NWCG RT-130 course page and the <i>Interagency Standards for Fire and Fire Aviation Operations</i> - Red Book). Discussion indicated that RT-130 oversight and module development prioritization warrant further discussion among affected stakeholders, including, the OTC, Risk Management Committee, and NWCG staff. 	The Executive Board confirmed that the RT-130 core components are established and maintained by the NWCG. The NWCG staff will convene a stakeholders group to discuss RT-130 issues, develop recommend improvement actions, and report back to the Executive Board.
