# NWCG CURRICULUM MANAGEMENT ISSUE PAPER #60 MODIFICATION OF COURSE FORMAT FOR ICS CURRICULUM April 21, 2004

### BACKGROUND

The revision of the Incident Command System curriculum has begun. The project is divided into two groups, one for the I-100/200 revision and one for the I-300/400/401/402 revision; both groups have completed a first workshop. The subject matter experts (SME) are a diverse group including U.S. Forest Service, National Park Service, New York State Emergency Management, Kern County Fire Department, California; Fire Scope, State of South Dakota Wildland Fire Suppression Division, Wisconsin Emergency Management, and Boulder Colorado Fire Department Wildland Fire. The combined average teaching time for the ICS curriculum is over 10 years, with most SMEs teaching more than once a year.

#### **CURRENT STATUS**

The SMEs for the ICS curriculum have recommended changing the current course material format from the modular system to the standard format that currently is used for the courses within the NWCG curriculum (see attached course structure comparison chart). In their experience the field is not using the current modular format as stand alone modules as originally developed, but as a package at each level.

The groups determined the target audiences for the levels would be as follows:

- I-100 Entry level
- I-200 Entry level positions on IMTs, single resource bosses, etc.
- I-300 Line officers, strike team leaders, unit leaders, managers, etc.
- I-400 Command & general staff, agency administrators, area commander, etc.

The current modular format is confusing and cumbersome when ordering course materials. Changing to a standard course format would eliminate multiple NFES numbers as well as provide printing cost savings. Course content flow will be easier to achieve with the standard format and reduce the current repetitive information that currently exists.

I-401 and I-402 would remain as stand alone courses and be candidates for web-based training.

#### RECOMMENDATION

Change the current modular format to a standard NWCG course format.
